

## Overview for academic year 2016/17

<p><b>Overview</b></p>	<p>The purpose of the service pupil premium (SPP) grant is to support children and young people with parents in the regular armed forces.</p> <p>Pupils are eligible for SPP if they are an Ever 6 service child. For the financial year 2021-22, this means that either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• One of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces, and this is registered in the January 2021 census or</li> <li>• They have been registered as a service child in any school census since January 2016</li> </ul> <p>Pupils also qualify for the premium if one of their parents died while serving in the armed forces and they receive a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (AFCS) or the War Pensions Scheme (WPS). The SPP is only paid for pupils aged 4 and over in year groups reception to year 11.</p>
<p><b>What must the Service Premium be used for</b></p>	<p>In order to support the pastoral needs of service children, schools have flexibility over how they use the SPP, as they are best placed to understand and respond to the specific needs of those pupils for whom the funding has been allocated. <p><b>Service Premium Grant Allocation for this academic year</b></p>	<p>In the financial year 2021-22, schools will receive <b>£310</b> per eligible pupil. Lord Deramore's Primary School have received funding for <b>11</b> pupils, totaling <b>£3,410</b>, for the 2021/22 academic year. No further grants have been awarded by the MoD.</p>
<p><b>Summary of the main barriers to educational achievement faced by eligible pupils at the school</b></p>	<p>The children at Lord Deramore's Primary School, who are currently in receipt of the Service Premium grant, have a range of needs that pose barriers to releasing their educational potential. These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Emotional and social needs often due to high levels of transient education/school mobility/relocation</li> <li>• Academic 'catch up' needs due to disrupted school education</li> <li>• Challenging family circumstances (including potential anxiety and stress when parents are deployed on active service)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Summary of plans to spend the pupil premium this year</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• "Little Troopers" intervention and support group, delivered by the school's ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant)</li> <li>• Academy catch-up as part of the school tutoring programme. All Pupil Premium and Service Premium children will receive priority places.</li> </ul>
<p><b>How the impact will be measured of the actions undertaken</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All interventions and support will be evaluated for impact, including impact on pupil progress, pre and post intervention results and subjective judgements made by staff</li> <li>• Other objective and statistical measures will be taking into account, including the rates of progress made in the core subjects each term for</li> </ul>
