Overview	The government has provided additional funding of £320 million per annum for academic years since 2013 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The Sports Premium is ring-fenced and can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. In the year 2020-21 the premium is £16000 plus £10 per pupil.	
	The school's Sports Premium lead is the PE coordinator and Year 3 teacher, Mrs Bethany Charters. She is supported in her role by Mr Liam Holmes (Total Sports Coach) and Ms Emma Havercroft (Dance and Gymnastics Teacher).
