In line with the school's Enrichment Passport there are three "big ticket" opportunities, which we like parents to be aware of as they incur bigger costs (prices to be confirmed nearer the time):

- Year 4 day trip to London (approx. £90) spring/summer
- Year 5 one night residential to Robin Hoods Bay (approx. £120) spring/summer
- Year 6 two night residential to Robinwood (approx. £350) autumn term

We will be adding these to the relevant year groups to enable payment instalments throughout the year leading up to the payment deadline. Pupils in receipt of Free School Meals receive a 50% discount on these three trips. All educational day trips are paid for by the school for these families.

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals benefits, please ensure you apply via <u>https://www.york.gov.uk/SchoolMeals</u> - your child will receive free educational day visits and vouchers to use in payment for our after-school extra-curricular club programme.

## LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Leave of absence cannot be granted due to parental work commitments. The University of York fully supports the need for children to be in school during term time. Unauthorised absences of more than 2 weeks could result in your child being removed from our school's register.

If your child has 5 or more days of unauthorised absence in any academic year, parents and carers will automatically receive a fixed-term penalty notice - issued by the local authority. Our school no longer has flexibility in not issuing these. Therefore, <u>please</u> ensure that you do not book family holidays during school term dates as penalty notices are now issued across all schools in the city.
