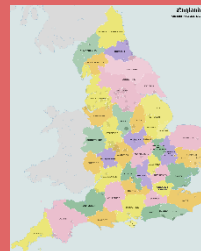
Be a Designer

Spend some time on TT Rockstars. See how far you can get!

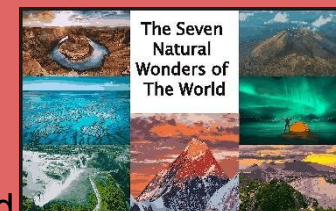
Be a Historian

Visit the National Railway Museum to learn more about the history of trains and especially Stephenson's Rocket.



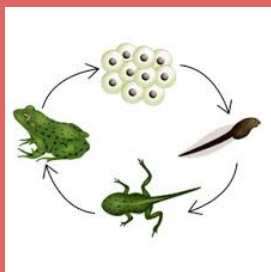
Be an Explorer
