English

Talk to a grown up you know about a special weather event they can remember from before you were born. Can they tell you what happened and where and what they did?




Music

Record the temperature for a week (with a thermometer or check online) and draw a simple chart showing the results




Reading

Find and read some poems about the weather. You could look in your local library, school library or even online.




Geography
