<p>Be a Historian</p> <p>There are lots of Roman sites in York. Visit one/some with grown up. <i>You don't need to visit the Yorkshire Museum because we will be going there on a trip.</i></p> <p>5 places where you can see Roman remains in York (3 are free) – Mama Adventure</p> 	<p>Be a Performer</p> <p>Pick a poem you enjoy and learn it off by heart. Think about how to perform the poem with prosody. It could be a poem by our class poet Michael Rosen or another poet you enjoy.</p> 	<p>Be a Geographer</p> <p>Do you know the names of the four countries of the UK and their capital cities? Do you know the names of the seas around the UK? What are the counties of England called?</p> 
<p>Be a Scientist</p> <p>All young animals change as they go through life and grow into adults.</p> <p>Find a creative way to show the life cycle of an animal you are interested in.</p> 	<p>Be a Mathematician (these are skills that we are aiming to secure by the end of Year 2)</p> <p>*Can you count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s and 10s? Practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables in random order.</p> <p>*Do you know doubles and halves up to 12/24?</p>	<p>Be a Scientist</p> <p>Investigate the names of parents and their young e.g. lion/cub, rabbit/kitten, shark/pup. How many pairs can you find? Write a list.</p> 
<p>Be an Artist</p> <p>Create a piece of 3D art/a sculpture using recycling, natural materials, play dough or salt dough, Lego or anything else you can find! It can be a model of something in particular or just an interesting shape. Look at it from different angles and maybe take some photos. Which view is your favourite and why?</p> 	<p>*Use a ruler or tape measure to measure some items around your house to the nearest cm.</p> <p>*Use an electronic scale to weigh small items from your house in grams. Can you put them in order from lightest to heaviest?</p>	<p>Be thoughtful</p> <p>😊 Talk to a grown up about who is in your family and how they relate to you e.g. cousin, aunt etc. Ask an adult to help you draw a simple family tree. Does everyone have the same sort of family?</p> <p>😊 Talk to a grown up about who your friends are and why they are your friends. Fold a piece of paper and draw your friends in groups e.g. school friends/not school friends or friends that do/don't like the same things as you.</p>
