Be a mathematician

Use Roman Numerals to create your own maths sheet full of simple questions (and answers!)
E.G: I + V = VI



Be a writer

Write a diary entry as though you are a Roman soldier. You might want to research what a day in the life of one was like before you start writing.



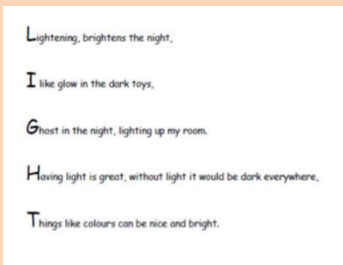
Be a constructor

Research a Roman building and build your own version using recycled materials from your house.



Be a poet

Write a poem about light and shadow. It could be a rhyming poem, an acrostic poem or free verse. You could decorate your poem too.



Be a designer

Roman gods and goddess were very important to the Romans. Research some of the most popular ones and then design your own. Draw and write a few sentences explaining your ideas.



Be a geographer

Use a map to locate all of the countries that were part of the Roman Empire at its most powerful in 117AD.



Be a shadow-maker

Inspired by this term's science topic, draw a shadow picture. Use a torch or sunlight to cast the shadow and then draw around it. Colour and label it.



Be an artist

Romans were well known for decorating their homes and public buildings with mosaics. Design and then make your own using recycled materials like magazines or colourful cereal boxes.



Be a scientist

Write a quiz about the Romans and ask someone at home your questions. Make sure you know the answers so you can tell them if they were right or wrong! Can you set a challenge question too?
