Dear parents and carers,

On **Tuesday 16th June**, Big Talk Education will be visiting school to deliver our annual sessions that support our statutory Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) curriculum. A letter attached explains in more detail about their work in primary school.

These sessions form part of the Department for Education's statutory guidance for Relationships Education and Health Education and are designed to complement the learning already taking place within school.

The content delivered by Big Talk Education also reinforces key areas of our Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE) curriculum, which is taught through the *Jigsaw* scheme, as well as aspects of the National Curriculum for Science, including human development and reproduction.
