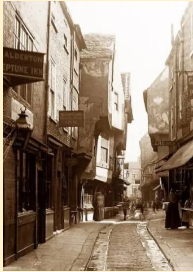
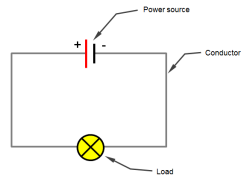


Year 4 Homework Menu – Autumn Term 2026/2027

Our topic this half term is Heslington Past Present. Below you will find a selection of homework ideas to share with your child. There is no homework book but each week, classes will share the activities they have done (this can be verbal or they can bring things in). These activities are designed to encourage a conversation about what your child is learning in school as well as helping develop discipline, creativity and independence in home learning.

Be a Geographer Take a look out of a window from your house. Make a list of all of the physical features and human features you can see. Which are there more of? Choose one to study in more detail. 	Be a Historian Research what evidence there still is today of Victorians in York. Present your findings by making a poster, video, animation, presentation of other way. . 	Wild Card! Learn a new skill to share with the rest of the class (e.g., a magic trick, basic sign language, tying knots, or a Victorian playground game like marbles or cat's cradle). 
Be a Scientist Create something that uses an electrical circuit. Describe how it works and what components are needed. Be an Author Write a creative diary entry from the perspective of a Victorian child visiting Heslington for the first time, describing the sights, smells, and daily routines. 	Be an Artist Create your own repeating pattern inspired by nature (using leaves, flowers, or garden plants)
