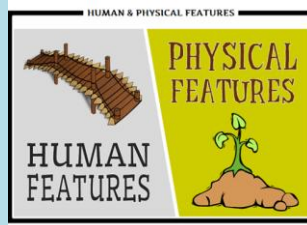


Year 6 Homework Menu – Autumn Term 2026/2027

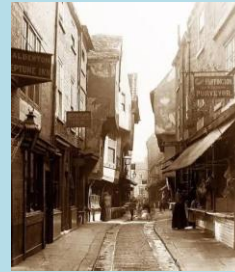
Be a Geographer

Make a list of the physical features and human features you can see. Which are there more of? Create a tally chart. Make a graph.



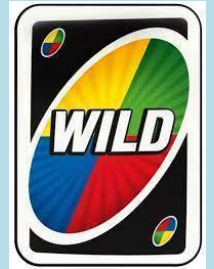
Be a Historian
